**Re: Case 19-G-0309 – Proceeding on Motion of the Commission as to the Rates, Charges, Rules and Regulations of The Brooklyn Union Gas Company d/b/a National Grid NY for Gas Service**

**Case 19-G-0310 – Proceeding on Motion of the Commission as to the Rates, Charges, Rules and Regulations of KeySpan Gas East Corporation d/b/a National Grid for Gas Service**

Dear Secretary Phillips:

Pursuant to Section IV.5.3 of the Joint Proposal adopted by the Commission in the above-captioned matters,<sup>1</sup> The Brooklyn Union Gas Company d/b/a National Grid NY (“KEDNY”) and KeySpan Gas East Corporation d/b/a National Grid (“KEDLI”) (collectively, the “Companies”) submit their report seeking independent review and cost recovery for the Greenpoint Vaporizer 13 and 14 Project. The Joint Proposal identified a set of on-system infrastructure investments designed to enhance reliability and address the supply/demand gap and in the Companies’ downstate New York service territories. The Joint Proposal provides a mechanism for independent assessment of these projects as a condition of cost recovery over the term of the rate plan. The Greenpoint Vaporizer 13 and 14 Project is an on-system infrastructure project subject to this mechanism. As described in detail in the attached report, the project consists of two new vaporizer units that will allow for more efficient extraction of liquified natural gas (LNG) from the existing Greenpoint LNG plant during periods of peak demand.

Section 5.3 of the Joint Proposal provides that the Companies will conduct at least one stakeholder meeting for the purpose of soliciting public input on the project within 30 days of filing the cost recovery report. Accordingly, there will be two virtual and two in-person public meetings regarding the Greenpoint Vaporizer 13 and 14 Project. Interested parties are invited to participate in these meetings. Two virtual and two in-person meetings are being conducted to provide scheduling flexibility for interested parties. The format and content of the meetings will be the same.
